We believe the transformative power of beauty, the arts and spirituality are tools that instill transcendent meaning into an environment and make it healing. Whether we are designing the interior of a hospice room, or creating the next issue of our journal, A Light in the Mist, these are the tools with which we comfort the suffering.

WHAT WE DO: Our Resource Center

Located in one of San Francisco's loveliest neighborhoods in a former antique store, our resource center stands as a beacon of comfort to the surrounding healthcare facilities.

In the front room visitors are welcomed into a homelike setting with comfortable couches and a beautiful array of meaningful art and objects. Bookshelves line the walls, filled to overflowing with books on art, spirituality, poetry, design and healing—as well as how to deal with illness, grief and loss. A large collection of video and audio tapes on these subjects are also available. In the back are healing poetic spaces for meditation, ritual and the therapeutic practice of sandtray.

Our resource center is open for research and quiet time as well as tours by appointment. (For further information, call 415-292-4040.)

WHAT WE DO: Our Design Services

We also provide interior design services for healthcare facilities, incorporating our unique vision of what is a healing environment.

Since 1997, we have designed two AIDS facilities in San Francisco, as well as the Client Services Division of the San Francisco AIDS Foundation. We have also designed two cancer centers outside of San Francisco and numerous smaller installations such as chapels, bereavement rooms, and palliative care rooms. In addition, we serve as consultants to hospitals and international groups.
